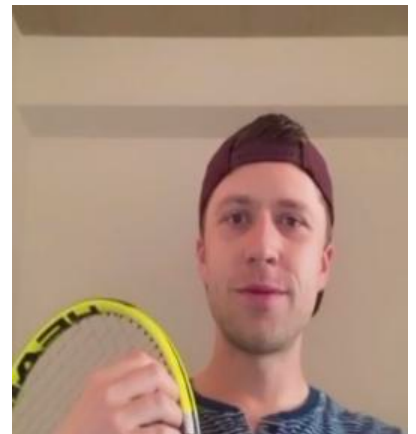
Andrew Bradley
